





ACTIVITY TREND




This graphic depicts the current year's total activity in comparison with the past three years.


"Activity" includes the following:

CITY & VILLAGE POLICE INCIDENTS




POLICE INCIDENTS BY TOWNSHIP



TOWNSHIP COMPARISON




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



FIRE/RESCUE CALLS BY DEPARTMENT




<u>Department ID Detail = </u>

Departments labeled <u>Rescue</u> – Provide an EMS Response


Departments labeled Ambulance – Have their own Ambulance Service

FIRE & RESCUE CALLS BY VENUE




EMS Calls by Venue


