

of St. Joseph County, Michigan, proprietors of
the Village plat of Colon do hereby give and
grant all the avenues, alleys and streets
laid out in said Village for public uses
agreeably to law in such case made and

set our hands & seals this 21st day of December
A.D. 1843.

Beginning at a stake in the centre of Main Street opposite the S.E. corner of Block No 13 it being twenty
Rods & twenty three links East & North 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East. Ninety two links from the interior section corner of
T. 6 S of R. 9 W Situate on the S.W. 1/4 of section 11. (Magnetic Variation 40° 20' East) St. Joseph County, Michigan
State Street is 100 feet wide, Canal Street is 6 Rods wide, Main & St. Joseph Streets are 5 Rods wide all the
rest of the Streets are 3 Rods wide, Alleys are 1 Rod wide Main Street bears North Seventeen & a half degrees east
& the rest of the Streets is at right angles with it.
