

## Plat of Kensington Heights Addition

To the City of Sturgis, St. Joseph County, Michigan.

Description of Land Platted.

The land embraced in the annexed plat of Kensington Heights Addition to the city of Sturgis, St. Joseph county, Michigan, is described as follows: Beginning 804.08 feet south of the northeast corner of section 12 in township 8 south of range 10 west and running thence west 1815.85 feet to east line of Maple Avenue in said city of Sturgis, Michigan; thence south 178.45 feet along said east line of said Maple Avenue to the south line of Cottage street; thence east 490 feet; thence south 85.55 feet; thence east 1325.85 feet, and thence north 264 feet to the place of beginning.
