Know all men by these presents that I, Addison P. Drake of St. Joseph, Michigan, proprietor of the village of Ivanhoe, to the village of St. Joseph, do hereby give and grant to all the streets and alleys laid out in said addition, the village of Ivanhoe, to the parties, for public purposes agreeably to the state, in such case made and provided. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of May A.D. 1818.
