### For 2021 Annual Report Juvenile Division of Family Court

This is my fifth annual report and the fourth report based on statistics that were compiled mostly on cases occurring during my four years on the bench.

The Delinquency cases have become more difficult, dealing with issues of drug and alcohol abuse, possible mental illness, parents with a lack of parenting skills, and trauma suffered by children who have been adopted or placed in foster homes after abuse/neglect in their primary home.

Detention days we utilized were 401 days in 2021 which came to approximately \$56,000. (The equivalent of 28 juveniles being in detention for an entire year). Like last year and years prior, much of the detention resulted once again from delinquents already on probation, repeatedly violating their probationary orders. The long-term treatment of CSC offenders has also played a part.

The Court believes violators of probation must be dealt with by immediate consequences. We live in a small community and word of the Court's actions or lack thereof quickly spreads.

We have continued to decrease usage of the Detention Facilities. Pre-covid there was a substantial decrease in the utilization of detention services with a big change in philosophy. With Covid and its aftermath, there has been even less usage of Detention Facilities due to a statewide shortage of employee. In 2021, it was budgeted \$260,000 for Detention stays but with the new philosophy and environment the Detention expenditure was less than \$60,000.

We continue to use the Juvenile Day Treatment Program (JDT). In my opinion, this is an effective program that deals with a limited number of children at a time. We have some devoted employees who try very hard to help the children who attend the program. We operate a credit recovery program at JDT. This is a good program to assist our juveniles to

catch up closer to where they should be scholastically, with a view toward assisting as many juveniles as possible to complete the requirements to graduate from high school. We also offer the students life skills training such as cooking and preserving food from the fields to the table. We also emphasize empathy for others who are less fortunate so that our students visit people in nursing homes and help with very delayed and impaired children at Pathfinders Center.

The Court has continued to partner with the ISD, the Sheriff's Department and the Prosecuting Attorney's Office to work on the issue of school truancy. I expect there to be statewide legislation passed this year to spell out in detail how truancy cases will be dealt with uniformly across the state. Of course, I thought that would happen last year and the year before, but it did not.

Cases of abuse and neglect of children continue to be a large part of the Court's docket. The statistics show 33 new petitions were filed in 2021 which is down from previous years which is also due to the covid aftermath. The Court is very wary as to the drastic consequences and changes the Department of Human Health and Services has had to endure in the past few years. The unreported, uninvestigated situations in this county is a major concern for the residents of St. Joseph County in the coming future. Methamphetamine use and continues to be a scourge on the families in St. Joseph County. Law enforcement, the Prosecuting Attorneys, and my fellow Judges are in full agreement with this statement, and we will continue to work together to help our children caught in the middle of this continuing nightmare. In addition, we are now seeing heroin use appearing on the rise.

The past and current support of the County is greatly appreciated, and I look forward to continuing a good working relationship in the future.

### **Youth Programs and Services**

All In-Home Services components are reimbursable to the County from the State, at a rate of 50%. The philosophy of using in-home services is to keep the child in the home instead of using out of home placement. Using in-home services allows the Court to prevent removal from the home, or if a child is placed outside the home, it expedites placement back to the home. The in-home services have been extremely effective in cutting down recidivism by youthful offenders.

History has shown that delinquency is not exclusively a child specific issue, but also a family issue, which could range from inability to adequately parent the child to not being able to pay for required medications. The in-home care components, such as parenting classes and emergency needs, allows the Court to assist the families in overcoming these barriers, thereby taking the stress off the families and helping them to concentrate on other issues.

Adolescents Recovery Court (ARC) — 2021 was the first full year of this program. During this year we had 6 juveniles pass through. This program is a 12-month program and on average could be up to a year and a half. This program is very intensive with weekly hearings in a wraparound environment which challenges the juveniles and parents. It encourages and promotes mental health services. This program involves CMH, ISD, Prosecutor's Office, a Defense attorney, and Juvenile Court Staff. This program is in its infancy and four of our juveniles were discharged unsuccessfully either for moving out of jurisdiction or not a good fit. There have been 2 graduates from this program which we are very proud of and continue to support even after our jurisdiction ended. Currently, in 2022 we have 5 juveniles.

Juvenile Day Treatment (JDT) — Educational instruction is provided from 8:00 am to 2:30 pm. The afternoon portion (until 4:00 pm) focuses on treating not only the youth through a variety of therapeutic services but helping parents better understand why their youth got into trouble and how they can become more effective parents. The results have been outstanding since the program started in 1999 and a great savings to the County for youth who could have been institutionalized. In 2021 even with the covid pandemic we have an average of 9 juveniles go through the program. Most of these kids loved the smaller and therapeutic setting compared the schools in which they came from. The big task for this Court and JDT is to reintegrate the juveniles back into the public school to make sure that transition to successful.

**Community Service** – Provides a consequence to youth and enforces a work ethic in them. Youth take pride in their accomplishments and at the same time repay society. Community Service has been a valuable and effective tool for the Court.

**Peer Plus** — Is a group interaction program for teens. It is designed to emphasize the strengths and potential of the participants through a positive group environment. The goals of peer plus include reaching a greater understanding of self and others, acquiring more effective communication skills and learning ways to deal with stress and substance abuse issues.

Adolescent Drug Education Program — This program is designed for youth who have experimented with substances. The main objective of this course is to educate adolescents on the harmful effects of drug usage and to encourage them to find activities besides the use of drugs. Many times, the result is a referral to more substance abuse therapy.

Family Services —Resource Families Support Services is a program that was implemented in 2010 to provide support within the community to foster care families. The objective is to expedite permanency for children in foster care, minimize emotional trauma to children taken out of the home, and ensure timely reunification to families that are or may come under Court jurisdiction. Revision of this program will be examined this year to ascertain that the object of the existence of the program remains consistent of its stated goals.

Casa - Casa provides highly trained community volunteers to advocate for the BEST INTERESTS of abused and neglected children in foster care. CASA Volunteers investigate the facts of the child's situation, they learn everything they can from everyone in the child's life. They communicate and share information with children's foster care workers, their lawyers and the court. They look for resources in the community. They advocate in the courtroom and make sure that the child's voice is heard.

Truancy Revision – During the preceding year there was a need to change the truancy policies in the county as the pandemic was waning and major issues were seen with attendance of students at school. A collaboration between the ISD, the School Districts, the Prosecutors office, the Sheriff's Department and the Juvenile Court produced a very mainstreamed and effective process for combating and holding students and parents accountable for truancy. Juvenile Court has seen a big increase in truancy conference and subsequently preliminary hearings. There were 111 truancy conferences scheduled in 2021. These are not part of any delinquency petition, but an alternative to formal court proceedings.

Regional Detention Support Services – The purpose of RDSS is to provide alternatives to jail and detention for juvenile offenders who have been detained and are awaiting a hearing and/or placement. RDSS is funded by a state grant. Money utilized is for holdover costs, inhome detention and transports to/from detention facilities. The State provides the training for these workers.

Holdover Site – Used primarily for delinquent youth who are arrested and cannot be returned home until a detention hearing is held with a Referee. The holdover site has been an asset to the Court for over 30 years. The site is at the Sheriff's Department and by law has no locks on the door. The juveniles are under constant adult supervision of trained personnel.

**CSC Offender Counseling** — Once a youth has been adjudicated for a sexual offense, an assessment will be done to determine the need and extent of treatment. If treatment/therapy is indicated then usually one-on-one services with a therapist begins, however there is also a group component. Reports by the therapist will show progress or lack thereof. Any violation or lack of effort on the part of the youth will be brought before the Court for further hearing.

Anger Management — Both individually and in a group setting, youths are taught effective means for dealing with their anger that may be exhibited in their offense or dealing with people

in the home, school or community. This is especially useful at JDT and even consent youth to teach new ways to look at their behavior.

**GPS Tether** - This year we have utilized GPS tether in a greater capacity than years past. This is partly due to the inability to use detention facility and partly a change in philosophy. When attached to the juvenile's ankle it allows case workers to track their location to ensure they are complying with the rules of probation. The tether reports include maps of their travels, can be accessed from case worker's computers at work or at home. This service is paid for by the State of Michigan.

In-Home Detention – The purpose of this program is to provide intensive supervision of youths either in their home or in foster care, that are identified by the Court as high risk of eventual institutionalization, if intensive supervision is not utilized. The in-home workers are not caseworkers, but are people trained by the Court and are matched with each youth on a case-by-case basis. They contact the youth at least once daily during the school week, or as agreed upon with the referee and caseworker, to assure compliance and to talk with the youth and the family. The in-home worker keeps in contact with the youth's regular caseworker and reports any problems, needs or violations of the youth. As the youth progresses during in-home detention, the frequency of intensive supervision lessens, depending on the circumstances of the case and how the youth is doing.

RTA — Raise the Age was in full swing in 2021. The Juvenile Court assigned a raise the age probation officer and allowed the county to take advantage of a full reimbursement for that position from the state. The raise the age also created an increased workload in Juvenile Court as Tickets for defendants under 18 are now the jurisdiction of Juvenile Court due to law changes. This will be seen in 2022.

### **Out of County Detention Facilities**

Without having our own detention facility for juveniles. We rely on other counties or agencies to provide the facilities when it becomes necessary to remove a delinquent youth from their home. They must be removed not only for criminal behavior to protect themselves and society, but it is also used for probation violations. Long term treatment after a formal adjudication is also sometimes necessary. Detention costs range from \$200.00 to \$300.00 per day, or more depending on the facility and type of treatment. This past year has been a challenging for finding detention facilities, respite placement etc., due to the aftermath of the Covid Pandemic. The current situation is that most facilities will only take their own counties juveniles. Across the state there is a staffing shortage and not a bed shortage.

#### **Youth Detention Facilities**

**Calhoun County** - Located in Marshall, Calhoun County has become our primary detention facility, and they have agreed to reduce detention costs \$200 a day. Calhoun County detention components are designed to meet each individual youth's needs. The following programs have been implemented to ensure that their needs are met nutritional program, religious services, educational program, recreational program, hygiene program, health services and counseling services.

Maurice Spears - Located in Lenawee County, approximately 2 hours away from St. Joseph County was our most used facility for 2021.
