


The Treasurer's Office core responsibilities include:

- Handling and reconciling all county funds
- Investing County funds while considering fund safety, liquidity and yield requirements
- Purchasing and collecting delinquent property taxes for 16 Townships, 6 Villages and 2 Cities
- Working with the local unit Treasurers and Assessors to process any property tax adjustments and report accurate values to the State of Michigan and taxing jurisdictions
- Selling and maintaining accurate records of all dog licenses in the County (in cooperation with Animal Control)
