



### 2021 Jail Population by Gender



### St. Joseph County Jail Chaplain Year End Report for 2021 Submitted by Rev. Bob L. Renner, Interim Chaplain

- ▶ The year 2021 continued to be somewhat unusual as we continued to deal with outbreaks of Covid 19. Yet the faithfulness of the Lord Jesus Christ is very evident in hearts that have been changed through the Jail Chaplain Ministry. For the past two years, because of Covid, we have not been able to hold the fall banquet. It is vital to give an update on ministry to the faithful churches and organizations that pray for the ministry. The ministry is blessed to have the financial donations of churches and organizations in our community to provide supplies that are needed, while everyone involved in the ministry gives of their time as volunteers.
- ▶ Words can't express the gratitude I have for Tracey Cole of Riverside who took leadership of all the women's ministries in the Chaplain program. The Riverside Church led the Celebrate Recovery ministry, and their team was amazing in presenting the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- ► The CR team is doing an amazing job reaching men and women with a hope of making life changes. They recorded 30 men and 16 women responding to an invitation to dedicate their life to following Jesus. Covid has kept the teams from ministering from time to time, but the Holy Spirit is always working.
- ▶ I met with 178 male inmates in a one-to-one session praying with each one. This year I had the joy of praying with 14 men who received Jesus as their Savior or dedicated once again their life to follow him.
- ► The spiritual guidance and counseling the Chaplin ministry can offer through giving out Bibles, spiritual literature including Bible studies and thought-provoking books to read all aid in faith building opportunities.
- ► There are so many wonderful people from various churches in the community who offer hope to the inmates through various kinds of services and ministries. Here is a list of those churches involved with the Sunday services at the jail:
