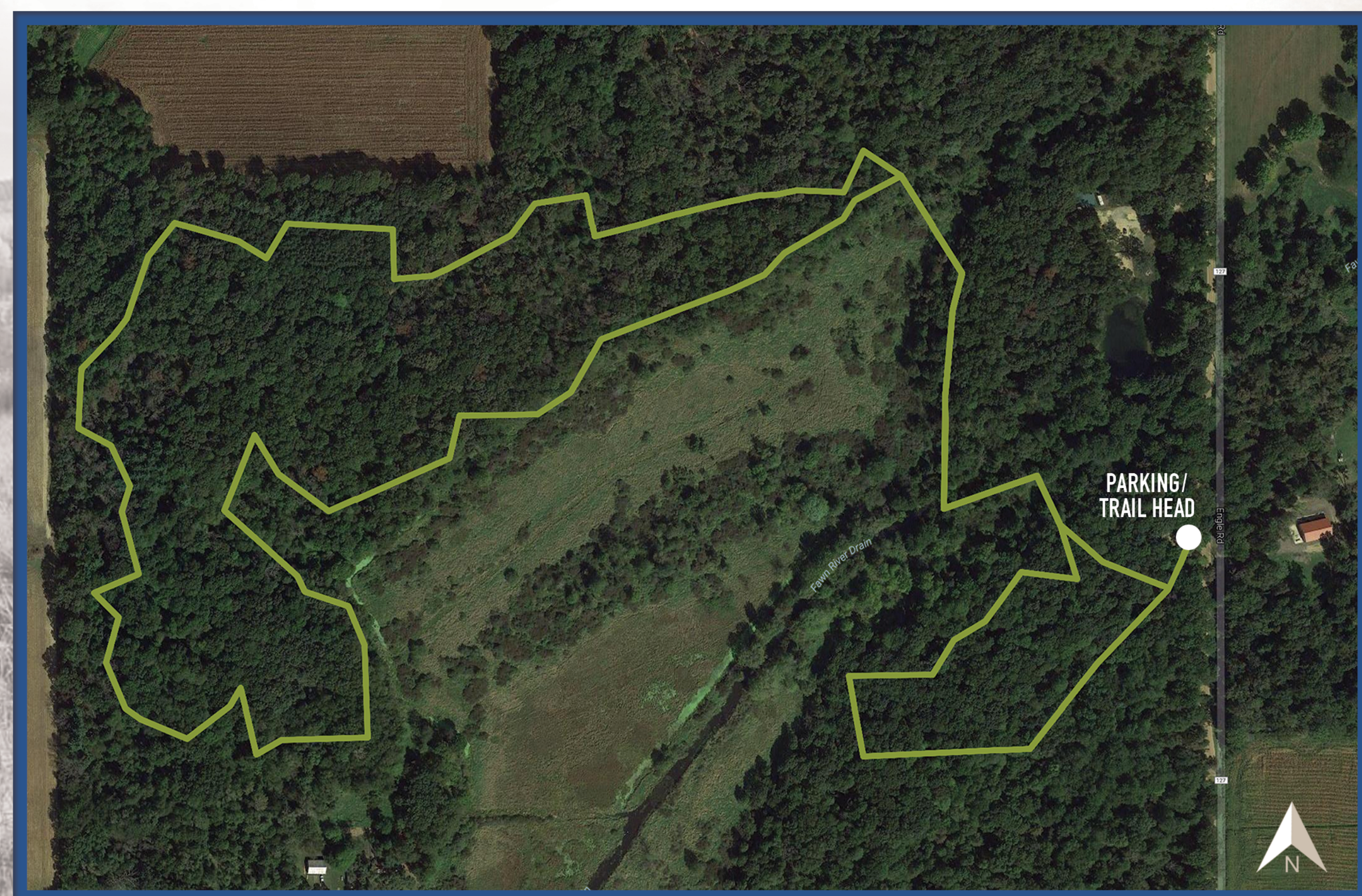

## WHY ARE WETLANDS IMPORTANT?

Wetlands perform a dazzling array of ecological functions that we have only recently begun to appreciate. A century ago the president of the American Health Association promoted the idea of a national campaign to eliminate wetlands. Today, scientists recognize the environmental benefits that wetlands provide, and they are now alerting us to the importance of preserving rather than eliminating our wetland resources. Your wetland is likely performing vital ecological functions that were barely recognized a few short years ago.

Even now our understanding of the complexities of wetland ecosystems is still developing, and it seems the more we learn, the more valuable wetlands become. Wetland ecologists have already documented the following environmental benefits of wetlands: water purification, flood protection, shoreline stabilization, groundwater recharge, and streamflow maintenance. Wetlands also provide habitat for fish and wildlife, including endangered species. Not all wetlands provide all of these benefits, and how your particular wetland works depends on its location and its type.
